Neighborhood Block Safety—Flamingos Not Required

Become a Block Club Leader and help fight crime

Never mind Charlie, do you feel crime creeping into Linden Hills? **Block clubs are a proven way of keeping a neighborhood safe, one block at a time.**

On Monday, June 12, over 80 residents gathered to hear from Minneapolis police about how to keep their children and community safe. **Inspector Kris Arneson, Lt. Marie Przynsky** and retired officer **Julie Brunzell** presented a wealth of information that can be viewed at www.linden hills.org under *Block Clubs and Safety*. One of the major themes of the evening was the importance of having an organized block club allowing neighbors to know each other and look out for each other.

LHiNC gives back

Interpretive Trolley Signs Installed

In 2005, the Minnesota Streetcar Museum successfully applied to LHiNC for a \$750 grant to install a series of interpretive signs along the Como-Harriet right of way. **The signs have now been installed.** There are 12 aluminum signs, each 2' x 2'. The signs include a historic photo of the Como-Harriet Line in service and are displayed so the viewer is looking at the same view today. Please take a few moments next time you are down by the streetcar and enjoy the new signs, funded in part by LHiNC Festival proceeds. ♦

Race for the Bandshell

This year marks the **20th anniversary of the Lake Harriet Bandshell** and the **2nd anniversary of its refurbishment** by a coalition of business partners and citizen volunteers. **Celebrate by participating in a 5K race around Lake Harriet to raise money for a Bandshell Preservation Fund.** This family-oriented race will be held **September 10**, in conjunction with the City of Lakes 25k. Entry fees are \$12 in advance or \$15 the day of the race; fees above \$5 are tax deductible and net proceeds are designated to the long-term preservation and enhancement of the Lake Harriet Bandshell and Refectory.

The Race for the Bandshell is organized and sponsored by **People For Parks**, a 501(c)3 organization established in 1978, dedicated to allowing park users and citizens to contribute to the maintenance and improvement of the park system. 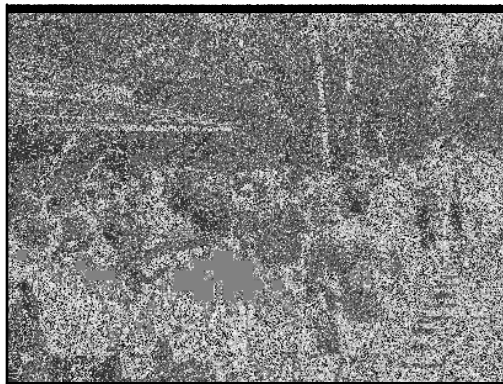

Minneapolis Parks Plants 4,000 Trees

Water your newly planted boulevard tree

The Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB) has planted over 4,000 trees on boulevards and in parks throughout Minneapolis this spring—128 in Linden Hills. Forestry crews will complete the first two waterings and place four to six inches of wood chips at the base of each tree. After this initial care, **each new boulevard tree becomes the responsibility of the property owner.** To maintain a healthy new tree, they should be watered once or twice a week. Watering is not required during any week that rainfall levels reach one inch or more.

The best way to water a new tree is to use a garden hose with the water turned on at a slow rate for two hours. Let the water soak into the ground to a depth of 18 inches. This is where 90% of a tree's roots grow. If a garden hose is not available, ten gallons of water will properly soak a new tree. Try to use the same amount of water each time.

Maintain a four inch layer of mulch, such as wood chips, around a new tree. Young or newly planted trees should have a two foot radius of mulch placed a few inches away from the trunk of the tree. The MPRB provides woodchips at sites throughout Minneapolis, including the southeast side of Lake Calhoun. To find a distribution site go to www.minneapolisparcs.org or call 370-4900. ♦

Therefore, LHiNC is looking for a volunteer to contact each Linden Hills block club leader and update contact information.

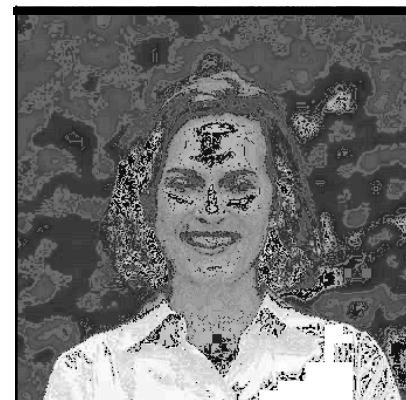

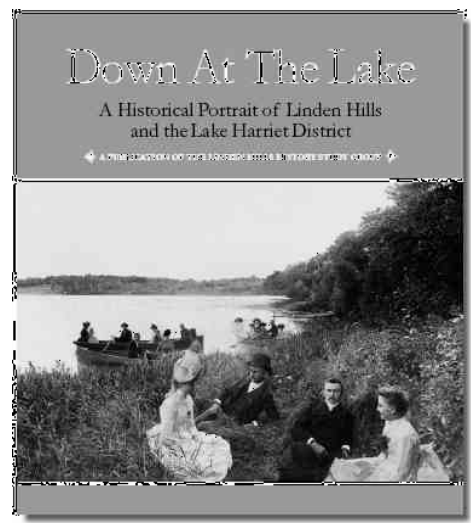
Linden Hills History Book
